“10 Facts About WW II You May Or May Not Know”

1. In England, a Red Cross worker was checking on a G.I. who was wounded in the Battle of the Bulge. She picked up his chart to see how he was wounded. After reading his chart she said, “how did you get shot with two arrows?” The G.I., who was a full blooded American Indian said, “that’s my name, not my injury!”
2. The Italian campaign, which lasted 275 days cost General Mark Clark’s 5th Army 125,000 casualties, including more than 20,300 killed. Rome was liberated on June 4th 1944, just 2 days before the Normandy Invasion.
3. During the tank battle of Kursk, Russia in July, 1943, the Russians on a front of 12 miles gained just 6 miles at a cost of 25,000 dead and the loss of 35 tanks.
4. During the Bataan Death march in April, 1942, an American Prisoner was a former Notre Dame football player. His 1935 class ring was taken from him by a Japanese guard. It was later returned to him by a Japanese officer who explained, “I graduated from Southern California in 1935.”
5. President Roosevelt was paralyzed from the waist down, but was never photographed in a wheelchair or with his leg braces and the press never wrote about his disability. As a result, many Americans never knew he was crippled.
6. At the end of the war, when Russian POW’s were sent home, Joseph Stalin sentenced them to prison for the crime of being captured by the Germans during the war. (Nice army to serve in!)
7. Hitler had to be the dumbest Commander in Chief of all time! During the Normandy Invasion he was 600 miles away and directed his generals and his army and told them what action to take.
8. In 1939 Germany, there began a euthanasia program in which about 80,000 to 100,00 disabled, mentally handicapped or insane were murdered. (A bad time to be sick in Germany.)
9. The battle for Iwo Jima was the only battle in which the U.S. Marines had more casualties than the Japanese. The Marines had 26,800 casualties, including 6,821 killed, while the Japanese had 21,216 casualties, including 21,000 killed.
10. When the French surrendered to the Germans in 1940, it was in the same railroad car that Germany surrendered to the Allies in 1918 ending WW I. After the French surrender in 1940, Hitler had the railroad car blown up.
