Chaplains Report

As Knights of Columbus, as Christian gentlemen, how well have we been preparing for Easter, through the Spiritual Journey in the desert of Lent? Palm Sunday is on April first this year and it is the beginning of Holy week which will lead to the culmination of our Lenten preparations for Easter Joy. How well are we doing? The time for preparation is running out.

The Gospel for the fifth Sunday of Lent can reveal much about ourselves, and what we may have discovered so far in our Lenten journey. For those of us who have attended one of the many penance services during the season, or have made a worthy confession, we have discovered a reality about ourselves to the deepest recesses of our hearts. We have discovered that we are sinners, and without Jesus Christ in the center of our lives, present in our hearts, present in our minds and present in our hands, we can do nothing at all.

The plot of the gospel is clear and easy to remember. The woman caught in adultery was not brought to Jesus, because the Scribes and the Pharisees wanted to save her eternal soul, they overpowered and dragged her to Jesus in order to entrap him. "Moses commands us to do this, so what do you say?"

Jesus first seems to ignore the questioners, knowing the hardness and the darkness of their hearts. He had been teaching, he now bends down to the ground and begins to write in the sand with his finger. His accusers have a clever trap set, they will not let this opportunity pass by, so they persist with their question.

"So what Teacher, what do you say?"

"The one without sin, throw the first stone."

Each, beginning with the wisest, walk away, knowing their own sins. But they, who are in sin, walk away from Jesus, one by one, they walk away from the source of mercy and forgiveness, one by one they walk way to return to their lives of ignorance, darkness and sin. They leave the woman alone, she is the only one to remain, trusting, perhaps a bit fearfully, prepared to accept her punishment from the Teacher.

Does the woman get off, with Jesus condoning her behavior, simply accepting it? No, by the power of God, Jesus forgives her. He does not condemn her, but instructs her to commit that sin no more. The woman has her human life here on Earth saved from the angry mob by the presence of the gentle Shepherd, Jesus, and the woman receives full forgiveness from God in the mercy and compassion of Jesus.

Columbus Club Report



10 Facts About World War II with Carmine Sacchitello PGK

1. General Terry Allen was the only U.S. General to command 2 infantry divisions in WW II. He commanded the 1st Infantry Division from Oct. 1942 to July 1943 and the 104th Infantry Division from Sept. 1944 to the end of the war.
2. In June 1945, after the war was over in Europe, General Patton returned to The U.S. for a visit with his family. Before returning to Europe, he visited Walter Reed Army Hospital, where his daughter volunteered. He visited the amputee ward. Upon seeing these men, he cried and said, "men, all I can say is, if I had been a better General, most of you wouldn't be here in this hospital."
3. The only person able to release the German Armored Divisions in Normandy on D-Day was Hitler and he was sleeping. About the time he awoke (12:00 noon) and did release them it was too late (no one would dare wake him).
4. In Nov. 1942, German U-Boats sank allied ships with over 860,000 tons of supplies bound for England.
5. In Sept. 1941 the German Army encircled large concentrations of Russian soldiers in the Ukraine, taking more than 660,000 prisoners. It was the largest mass capture in military history.
6. Calvin Graham was 12 years old, 5 ft. tall and 105 lbs. yet he was able to join the navy and won a Purple Heart before the Navy realized it and sent him home. He reenlisted when he was 17 years old.
7. When the 1st Marine Division invaded the island of Peleliu in the Pacific in 1944, the average temperature was 115 degrees.
8. About 370,000 enemy soldiers were taken prisoner in Tunisia, North Africa. The largest the Allies captured in the war. In 3 years of fighting in Africa, the Axis lost nearly 1 million men, either killed or captured.
9. Three weeks after the Normandy invasion, the Allies had 1,000,000 men, 177,000 vehicles and 500,000 tons of supplies ashore in France, with more on the way.
10. The British passenger ship Athenia was the 1st ship sunk in WW II. 112 people lost their lives. Among them, 28 Americans. The H.M.S. Athenia was sunk by a German U-boat on Sept. 3, 1939.

USS NEW YORK

With less than a year to go before it even touches the water, the Navy's amphibious assault ship USS New York has already made history. It was built with 24 tons of scrap steel from the World Trade Center.

USS New York is almost complete and should be ready for launch in mid-2007 . Katrina disrupted construction when it pounded the Gulf Coast last summer, but the 684-foot vessel escaped serious damage, and workers were back at the yard near New Orleans two weeks after the storm.

It is the fifth in a new class of warship designed for missions that include special operations against terrorists. It will carry a crew of 360 sailors and 700 combat-ready Marines to be delivered ashore by helicopters and assault craft.

"It would be fitting if the first mission this ship would go on is to make sure that bin Laden is taken out, his terrorist organization is taken out," said Glenn Clement, a paint foreman. "He came in through the back door and knocked our towers down and (the New York) is coming right through the front door, and we want them to know that."

Steel from the World Trade Center was melted down in a foundry in Amite, La., to cast the ship's bow section. When it was poured into the molds on Sept. 9, 2003, "those big rough steelworkers treated it with total reverence," recalled Navy Capt. Kevin Wensing, who was there. "It was a spiritual moment for everybody there."

Junior Chavers, foundry operations manager, said that when the trade center steel first arrived, he touched it with his hand and the "hair on my neck stood up."

"It had a big meaning to it for all of us," he said. "They knocked us down. They can't keep us down. We're going to be back."

The ship's motto? - 'Never Forget'

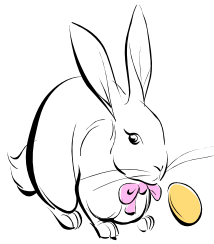

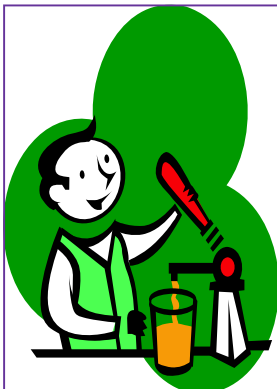
Youth Report

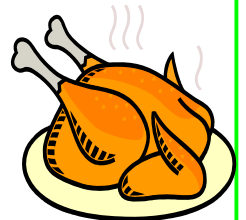

In October 1881, Father Michael J. McGivney, the curate at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut, explained to a small group of men meeting in the church basement that his purpose of calling them together was manifold: to help them remain steadfast in their Catholic faith through mutual encouragement, to promote closer ties of fraternity among them; and to set up an elementary system of insurance so the widows and children of deceased members would not find themselves in dire financial straits.

On March 29, 1882 the state of Connecticut granted a charter to The Knights of Columbus and since then our Order has grown to over 1.7 million members.

To honor Fr. McGivney, members of Council 2546 and their families attended a Founders Day Mass at St. Joseph's Church in Raleigh on March 11th. Msgr. Williams, pastor of St. Joseph's, was most gracious as He spoke about The Knights and all of their good works and their devotion to our Catholic faith. Before Mass ended, Grand Knight Rich Ferraro was invited to say a few words and as he closed his speech, he presented a certificate, signed by our newest members to Msgr. Williams as our Honoree for our 1st Degree that was held on January 20, 2007. Doughnuts, cakes, cookies and coffee were made available by The Knights for all to enjoy after Mass in The Churches social hall.
