## Trees Needed To Improve Grounds Around Our Council – Donations Needed!

The Columbus Club has identified two areas on the Council's grounds where trees would make a significant improvement.

The first area is directly across the parking lot from the front door of the Council. A number of trees (approx. 12) that have significant sound barrier characteristics need to be planted to reduce noise that tends to travel across the street into the subdivision adjoining our property. It has been suggested that Leland Cypress or Nelly Stevens Holly be planted for this purpose. If you have other suggestion please let Jerry Ryan or other Columbus Club members know your thoughts.

The second area is both sides of the drive from the curve coming into the grounds to the garage. This area is about 300 feet long. It has been suggested that Crape Myrtles (approx. 24) be planted in this area. Other suggestions are welcome.

Unfortunately, right now the Columbus Club has limited funds and is unable to purchase these trees. If however, folks are willing to donate some \$\$\$, we can make this happen this fall. Already there has been \$90 donated for this effort but at least \$200 more dollars are needed to make this happen. Please leave donations at the lounge with "tree donation" on the envelope. Thank you ahead of time for your help with this.

## “10 Facts About WW II You May Or May Not Know”

1. The U.S. invasion fleet in the waters off Okinawa in April, 1945 consisted of 1,300 ships including: 40 aircraft carriers, 18 battle ships, and 200 destroyers. Of the 120,000 Japanese on the island only 7,800 were captured or surrendered. The rest were killed. The U.S. suffered 49,200 casualties.
2. At the battle of the Coral Sea in May, 1942, the air craft carrier Yorktown was badly damaged. It was rushed back to Pearl Harbor for repairs and it was estimated it would take 90 days. By some miracle, the repairs were made in 45 hours. The carrier then sailed back to the South Pacific in time for the battle of Midway on June 4th 1942.
3. Poison gas was available to all the warring countries in WW II. However, only Japan (in China) and Italy (in Ethiopia) used it. Gas was widely used in WW I.
4. When the fighting in Poland ended 9Sept. 1, 1939 to Sept. 29, 1939) 60,000 Polish soldiers and 25,000 Polish civilians were dead. 700,000 Polish soldiers were taken prisoner. The Germans lost 14,000 killed.
5. When Germany conquered France in 1940, all French Jews were required to register with the police and list their homes, nationality and profession. French scholar Henri Bergson wrote on his form: “Academic, Philosopher, Nobel Prize Winner, Jew”.
6. Some British arms were 1st rate, such as the Spitfire fighter aircraft, but their tanks were so bad that they relied on the American Sherman for most of the war.
7. Auschwitz was a concentration camp in Poland where millions of Jews were killed. It was the worst of all such camps. However a camp in Prague known as Theresienstadt was pretty bad also. A Jewish survivor said, “ If Auschwitz was hell, Theresienstadt was the anteroom”.
8. The allied bombing campaign over Germany caused the deaths of 600,000 civilians and over 800,000 were injured.
9. On Luzon in the Philippines, the U.S. suffered 38,000 casualties, including 8,000 dead. The Japanese lost 170,000 killed
10. Nearly 100,000 U.S. prisoners were held in Europe and were treated well. Fewer than 1,200 died in captivity.
