10 Facts About WWII With Carmine Sacchatello PGK



1. The Zwaardvisch was a Dutch submarine built by the British, based in Australia and under American command. The Zwaardvisch sank the German sub U-168 on Oct. 6, 1944 while the U-168 was en route to Japan with technical data. It was one of the best allied efforts of the war. "That's teamwork".
2. Ted Williams, one of the greatest baseball players of all time, joined the U.S. Marines in May, 1942 becoming a captain and fighter pilot in WWII. Williams flew over 1,100 hours between 1942 and 1945. He also flew as a fighter pilot in the Korean War.
3. The building of the atomic bomb, known as the Manhattan Project, took just 2 years, 3 months and 16 days to produce.
4. From 1940 to 1945 the U.S. defense budget increased from 1.9 billion to 58.8 billion dollars.
5. In May, 1942 the Japanese started to build a railway connecting Burma and Thailand with 46,000 allied POW's and about 100,000 Burmese slave laborers. In Oct. 1943 the railway was complete at the cost of 16,000 POW lives and over 50,000 Burmese lives. Also included in this project was a bridge built over the River Kwai.
6. The top 6 aces of WWII were: Erich Hartman of Germany with 352; Major Walter Nowotny of Austria with 258; Captain Hiroyoshi Nishizawa of Japan with 103; Colonel Ivan Kozhedub of Russia with 62; Captain Constantine Cantaaoozino of Rumania with 60 and Major Richard Bong with 40 enemy air craft shot down.
7. Ash Wednesday was a nickname given by the residents of Cairo, Egypt on June 17, 1942. As German General Rommel advanced toward that city the British burned all their secret documents and the ashes filled the sky over Cairo.
8. Lt General Walton Walker Commanded the U.S. XX Corps in WWII. The 3 stars he wore had belonged to General Patton before Walker and to General Eisenhower before Patton. General Walker was killed in Korea in 1952.
9. The gunboat U.S.S. Wake was moored at Shanghai and captured by the Japanese in a surprise move on Dec. 7, 1944 while the crew slept. The Japanese rechristened the ship "Tataru".

Just for the record: "The **Boeing B-52 Stratofortress** is a long-range **strategic bomber** flown by the **United States Air Force** (USAF) since 1954. It replaced the **Convair B-36** and the **Boeing B-47**. Although built for the role of **Cold War**-era nuclear deterrent, its conventional capabilities take priority. The aircraft has an extremely long range, carries a heavy weapons load and is economical in operation compared to the rest of the USAF strategic bomber fleet."
